Leicestershire Police reported in different Panel meetings that they will continue to utilise the current primary recognised risk assessment tool – DASH – as recommended national Authorised Professional Practise and will train staff on its use in line with recognised national best practice. They will not, therefore, adopt the Respect Toolkit. That said, elements of the Toolkit do feature in their Domestic Abuse Matters training package to officers. The DA Matters programme will continue which provides inputs to frontline officers and investigators regarding domestic abuse which incorporates some of the principles outlined within the 'Respect Toolkit' – for example how perpetrators may try to influence and manipulate officers/investigators, and potentially		Ongoing

Enquiries have also been made with the lead officer for the newly formed DA Local Partnership Board (an LLR wide strategic body) regarding the possibility of incorporating the Respect Toolkit or elements of it into its workstreams.
